- C. Sheriff- Deputy Mohney reported that there were 51 complaints in the month of May. Deputy Felix is on vacation and will be back for the next meeting.
- D. Fire Board- Mike Sullins reported in place of Chief Babcock. There were 7 calls in Bangor Township in the month of June with an average response time of 4:58 Minutes, bringing the year to date to 281.
- E. Pride Care- Steve Lowder reported that there were 6 calls for the month of June while Pride Care was working in the Township. The calls had an average response time of 10:43 minutes. The types of calls were 1 priority One calls, 4 priority Two calls, and 1 priority Three calls. It was a pleasure serving the Township and Steve looks forward to continuing to serve the Community through the Fire Department.
- F. Supervisors Report- Mike Sullins reported that the Camper on Bangor Covert road has been removed and the people who were living in it are cleaning up the debris. The property across from Getman's is also cleaning up their blight. Mike is still searching for a contractor who is qualified to remove asbestos at the old Hall. This next week is the July Board of Review.
- G. Road Commission- W.C. Askew reported that roadside mowing is ongoing and the next mow will be in late summer/ early fall. Current projects include county wide hot patching, Drain Improvements, and clearing tall plants that make it hard to see around corners. There have been no complaints of the new Director
